# Grants & Financial Resources for Farmers\*

Think of government grants as a public investment in agricultural innovation and community development.

#### **About USDA Grants**

There are **no grants to start a farm**, and there are very few grants for individual farmers.

Generally, grants **do not pay** for equipment, buildings, land, or production costs.

Grants can pay for education, outreach, marketing, and processing.

Grants usually require cash or in-kind match contributions and are paid as reimbursements (i.e. you spend \$1 to get a \$1). **They are not free money**.

The main grant-making USDA agencies are Rural Development and Agricultural Marketing Service. FSA offers special financing, and NRCS specializes in cost-share for conservation practices (Environmental Quality Incentives Program).

#### \*Stay Informed

This is an unprecedented time for grants and financial support for agriculture. Currently, the USDA is committed to building a broader, more resilient food system that supports local supply chains, organic and value-added products, and the full diversity of farmers. #### **USDA** Rural Development

- Value-Added Producer Grant (VAPG).
  - Can pay for processing and marketing costs of value-added product
- Renewable Energy for America Program (REAP)
  - Loans and grants for renewable energy equipment
- <u>Socially Disadvantaged Group Grant.</u>
  - Technical assistance from cooperatives

#### USDA Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS)

- Farmers Market Promotion Program (FMPP)
- Local Food Promotion Program (LFPP)
- Regional Food System Partnerships (RFSP)
  - All of these grant opportunities support local and regional food systems, and farmers can apply as long as there are multiple beneficiaries.

#### **USDA NRCS**

- Conservation Innovation Grant (CIG)
  - Develop conservation and resource management practices
- <u>Urban Agriculture and Innovative Production.</u>

#### USDA National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA)

- <u>Beginning Farmer and Rancher Development Program (BFRDP)</u>
  - Flexible program to support new farmers
- Small Business Innovation Research Program (SBIR)
  - Supports research to bring new products and systems to market

  - Farmer-led research to overcome production and marketing problems
